## Inauguration of new €7 million BioConnect Project

With the appointment of Midland Construction (Kells) to build the new Innovation Centre, BioConnect's Board is delighted to host Heather Humphreys TD, Minister for Rural and Community Development and Minister for Social Protection to formally inaugurate the €7 million, 1,639 square metre, research and innovation centre situated along the Armagh Road at Knockaconny in Monaghan at 11am on Monday 31st January, 2022.

Minister Humphreys TD said, "I am delighted to turn the sod to commence construction on this landmark project for County Monaghan. In my previous role as Minister for Business, I allocated almost €5million for the BioConnect Research and Innovation Centre under the Regional Enterprise Development Fund. This project will bring together a cluster of household names in the agri-food sector including Lakeland Dairies, Manor Farm, Bio-Marine Ingredients, Silver Hill Food and Herbal Crest and allow them to partner on ambitious research agendas with leading academic partners such as Queens University, Ulster University, Letterkenny and Dundalk Institutes of Technology and Monaghan Institute. Once complete, the new research centre will create hundreds of skilled jobs locally and will drive collaboration, innovation and research ensuring County Monaghan has a competitive advantage and will be at the cutting edge of food research nationally and internationally."



Enterprise Ireland Regional Manager for the North East, Aidan McKenna, added: "Enterprise Ireland is proud to back this important project. The BioConnect Innovation Centre draws on the strong agri-food reputation of County Monaghan and the North East region. The Centre will be a focus for innovation in the rapidly evolving agri-food business and ensure that our producers and entrepreneurs are at the leading edge of sustainable food production into the future."

Paul Clifford, Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Monaghan County Council and BioConnect Board Member, explained the strategic importance of the project, "Monaghan County Council is delighted to see works commence on this strategic, ground breaking project, with Monaghan Mushrooms, Enterprise Ireland and all our commercial and academic partners. We hope that BioConnect Innovation and Research Centre will create the platform for regional transformation, supporting biotechnology research and providing opportunities for graduate employment. The Centre will help companies throughout the region meet competitive challenges and develop enhanced new products for global markets."

Construction of the facility is expected to take around 50 weeks with hand over at the end of 2022.
